The Scholarship Booklet

This booklet is divided into Four Sections:

Some applications require additional information like an application form to be completed (i.e., Royal Canadian Legion which can be picked up at the office or downloaded on the Teams page). **See Section Two for additional information.**
- Section Three: Applications **will be sent directly** to the donor following the instructions in the booklet. **See Section Four for additional information.**
- Section Four: District Authority Scholarship. If you are applying for the District Authority Scholarship you will have to complete the form, example attached. You are also required to prepare present a presentation to the District Authority panel.
- Section Five: **These awards are available only to post-secondary students.**

TOP ACADEMIC AWARD – MCKECHNIE TROPHY

Amount: \$1250

Donor: North Okanagan Shuswap Teachers' Association (NOSTA)

Criteria:

- PVSS student with the highest final average based on the criteria below.
- The recipient:
 - a) has taken a minimum of ten academic courses;
 - b) has completed English 11, Mathematics 11, Science 11 (Biology, Chemistry, Physics) and Social Studies 11; and
 - c) has taken a minimum of four Academic Grade 12 courses with English 12 being one of the four.
- PVSS Administration and Counsellors with consultation with the PVSS Scholarship & Bursary Committee will determine the top candidates.
- The recipient will be informed by letter that they were the successful candidate.
- The recipient of this award will be recognized at graduation ceremony in the following year.
- NOSTA will pay directly based upon submission of proof of enrollment in an accredited post-secondary institution.

TOP ALL-ROUND STUDENT AWARD and BURSARY

- Scholastic Achievement – **must be on three of four honour rolls in their Grade 12 year.**
- Must reflect the qualities of a good citizen (see Top Citizen Award).
- Must be actively involved in one or both of the following at PVSS:

 - b) Fine Arts: significant contribution in one or more visual or performing art

Preference may be given to a student who participates in both
- Nominated and selected by the staff of PVSS.

- To be paid directly to student based upon submission of proof of enrollment in an accredited post-secondary institution.

 - Teachers in the technology areas will select the top student from among the technology courses offered at PVSS Consideration may also be given to grade point average and survey of courses taken
- Note: The award may go toward tuition or expenses related to courses being taken; for example, books or tools directly associated with the course of studies. Appropriate receipts must be forwarded to the PVSS Scholarship Committee.

DAVID SAGER BURSARY

Amount: \$500

Donor: Armstrong/Vernon Learning Disabilities Association

Criteria:

- Awarded to a PVSS student who has been assessed and identified with a learning disability OR a student who has known learning difficulties and received learning assistance during the school years.
- The Bursary may be claimed when the student provides documentation to show enrollment in further education. This may be college, university, a trade or any program which will enhance the student's future and job prospects.
- This award may go to tuition or expenses related to courses being taken; for example, boots or tools directly associated with the course of studies. Other acceptable expenses might be professional driving training, first aid courses, WHIMIS, Food Safe etc. Appropriate receipts must be forwarded to the PVSS scholarship Committee.
- Preference may be given to a student who has attended PVSS from grades 9-12.
- Selected by the Vernon Learning Disabilities Association in consultation with the PVSS Scholarship & Bursary Committee.

- Selected by the Leadership Teachers in cooperation with the PVSS Scholarship & Bursary Committee.

Complete the **PVSS SCHOLARSHIP & BURSARY APPLICATION FORM (online)**

- You will be required to go online and complete the online application form by clicking yes or no for each of the bursaries listed in this section of the book. You will have to pick one or the other before proceeding to the next question. Some bursaries require additional information so please look through the booklet and have your answers ready to copy and paste into the online form. Some information may need to be emailed to dropped off at the office by the March 11th due date.
- Once you have completed the form, you will be required to email the office at pvs@sd83.bc.ca to let the staff know you have completed the application.

Prepare and submit the following in hardcopy to the PVSS Office Staff:

1. ONE LETTER OF REFERENCE

- This letter will be forwarded to the donors for all the scholarships and bursaries checked off on the Bursary Application Form.
- Please make your request for your letter of reference as soon as possible. You need to make sure you give your person lots of time to compose the letter.
- Please ask your teachers to put your letter on School Letter Head.

- **Scholarships and Bursaries marked with * on the application require additional letters or application forms. See the information provided for what is required.**

- The successful recipient has up to December 31 of the second year after graduation (2.5 years) to enroll in an acceptable program and claim the bursary.
- The bursary recipients must have a photocopy of their proof of enrolment and the date of enrolment in an accredited post-secondary institution sent to the ASHA before the award is paid.

- **Ensure that additional information outlining evidence that the award criteria have been met is outlined in the online application.** This should include any activities within the community that would indicate “citizenship outside the classroom and the school.”
- **An independent letter of support (letter of reference) indicating activities within the community that would indicate “citizenship outside the classroom and the school” will need to be submitted to the PVSS Office with your other reference letter.**
- Selected by the City of Armstrong.

CHRIS PIEPER BURSARY

- Student must be in Grade 12 at PVSS.
- Must be **entering an agriculture or forestry field of study.**
- The recipient will be a deserving student who has demonstrated initiative and good citizenship, and is involved in many areas of school life, beyond course commitments, and has taken that interest outside the school into the Community.
- Selected by the City of Armstrong.

ELIZABETH & DONALD CHRISTIE MEMORIAL BURSARIES

Amount: \$7000 and \$3000

Donor: Estate of Elizabeth & Donald Christie

Criteria: **Please check with the PVSS office to learn more about the background of this scholarship**

- Two separate bursaries will be awarded. The recipients are students of PVSS that have the potential to attend post-secondary school but are facing financial constraints and may not be able to access a post-secondary education without help. The recipients may not have top grades through high school but must be capable of succeeding at the post-secondary level. They are resilient and display a desire to work hard in school and in the community.
- Recipients will be students at PVSS and will reside in the Armstrong or Spallumcheen area.
- Open to students who are entering any academic, technical or vocational pursuit.
- **Please provide information (300 words min. to 500 words max.) outlining what it means to you to be able to go to post-secondary school and how you would be affected if you did not have the finances to pursue a post-secondary education; how will you be affected if you were to receive this award; why you would be deserving of the award, and an indication of your post-secondary plans.**
- Recipients will have two years to claim these awards; however, the distribution will not occur until after the withdrawal date at the post-secondary institution. This will require the recipient to arrange with the post-secondary institution and PVSS in order to defer tuition payment until the bursary has been received.
- Selected by the PVSS Scholarship & Bursary Committee in co-operation with donor.
